Icebreaker ~ Lunch Trouble

Primary Lesson ~ Seeking Acceptance in All the Wrong Places

This is the first of two lessons on the power of peer pressure. Most peer pressure starts because people are seeking acceptance from the wrong places. It is all based on perception. Most people think that if they hang with the right crowd of friends, that others will accept them. Some also believe that if they wear the right clothes or do the certain things or join the right group, that then they will be seen as cool.

The first lesson to overcoming peer pressure is for people to realize that true acceptance comes from God and is not based on what you do but on who you are. If you are content with who God created you to be then you will be secure in yourself and others will be much more likely to accept you.



Facts, Figures & Illustrations

- The Sicilian Mafia is the original mafia in Italy and dates back to the 19th century.
- The term Mafia is not one that is actually used by members of this crime organization in Italy. The term *cosa nostra* or 'our thing' is preferred by Sicilian mafia members.
- Like all mafia groups in Italy, the Sicilian Mafia operates a code of honor and has a strict hierarchical structure. Recruits to the Mafia are sworn in to the family through secret ceremonies, after which point they become mafia members and are expected to stay so for life.
- The Sicilian mafia is most famous to the outside world because of its branch in America which arose out of mass migration from Sicily in the late 19th century.
- Inside Italy, The Sicilian mafia is particularly known for its assassinations of high profile figures including police chiefs, judges and politicians.
- The Mafia in Italy constitutes a formidable economic force which accounts for approximately 10% of Italy's Gross Domestic Product. Annual turnover of the Italian Mafia is estimated at around 10 billion Euros or about \$13.5 billion USD.

Discussion Questions

1. Talk to your group about the most difficult type of peer pressure you face in your life. Each person's can be different or the same.
2. Discuss how people evaluate their sense of identity (Hint: sports, clothes, music, etc.) How do most of your friends see themselves? Is it based on God's value of them or on other's?
3. All people want acceptance, which can only be found in Jesus Christ. Discuss the basis of acceptance that the father had for his son in the parable of the prodigal son (Luke 15:11-32). Did the father take him back because of good behavior, looks, or merit? Why?
4. Pray for each other that you will accept yourself the way God sees you and not fear what others think, say or do to you.



Complimentary Story ~ Moving a Mountain

A UK minister, David Hathaway, wrote the following. The people who imprisoned him tried to use every kind of pressure possible to get him to change his beliefs. David learned that trusting in God's intervention was the only way to overcome the ungodly system that was holding him. I will let him tell in his own words how he came across this remarkable true story.

32 years ago I was put in a communist prison in Czechoslovakia. They said if I did not give up my faith, they would not let me out alive – the only way to get out was to become a communist! They gave me books to re-educate me, one was the true story of Marco Polo (a merchant venturer from Italy 1254-1354) and his travels in China with the Emperor, Kublai Khan, grandson of Genghis Khan.

One day the Chinese Emperor and Marco Polo came to a village and found a small group of believers. The Emperor was very cruel and commanded his soldiers to kill them. But, he said, "Before I kill you, I will prove that your God is dead and your Bible is a lie. Your Bible says, if you've got faith like a mustard seed, you will see a mountain and command it to move, and it will go. Outside your village is a mountain – I'm going to give you three days to move it!"

The believers had three days to move the mountain! So Marco Polo said that they cried out the first day, "Oh God, we're going to die, move the mountain!" And the mountain did not move. The second day, they found one man 'more spiritual' than the rest and they made him do the praying. He prayed all day, "Oh God, we're going to die, move the mountain!" And still the mountain did not move. The third day, the Emperor came back, commanded his soldiers to line the believers up outside the village and cut off their heads!

But first, he said, "I gave you three days to move the mountain and it's still there! You have no God, your Bible is a lie, and I want you to die knowing that there is no God – you must pray one more time while I watch you! Then I'll kill you."

In that communist prison, with no Bible, this is what I read: Marco Polo said, that this time those believers began to pray differently. They looked at that mountain, and began to command it to move in the name of Jesus! As the Emperor watched, the mountain MOVED! He became a believer and sent Marco Polo back to bring missionaries to evangelize China. Because of that one miracle, the whole nation was opened to the Gospel and today there are more than 100 million believers in China! Why? Because God moved a mountain.

This story that David Hathaway read in that Czechoslovakian prison so inspired him that he began to speak to the mountain of his imprisonment. After only one year in the prison, the Prime Minister of England flew to Prague just to secure his release. He flew back to the UK with the Prime Minister and ended up on television and in the newspapers declaring the miracle God had done.
