Video Summary

His conclusions are very revealing concerning motives and relationships.



Icebreaker ~ Sand and Stone

Primary Lesson

Facts, Figures & Illustrations

- Sicily lies at the heart of the Mediterranean and is its largest island. It is home to more than 5 million residents.
- In Sicily is Mount Etna, which is the largest active volcano in Europe.
- Standing at almost 11,000 feet, Mount Etna dominates the Sicilian skyline. It is the most active volcano in the world and has erupted 200 times including April of 2007.
- In past history, Sicily has had many conquerors including the Greeks, Romans, Byzantines, Arabs, Normans and other French dynasties, various Spanish dynasties, and the Italian Garibaldi dynasty.
- It is reported that roughly 80% of all firms and businesses in Sicily pay protection money to the Mafia, while the remaining 20% require police protection.
- The Mafia is reported to be Italy's biggest business with earnings twice that of Italy's huge car company Fiat.
- In the mid 1980s large-scale trials called the maxi trials were held in Italy against the Sicilian Mafia.
- Of the 474 people accused, 114 were acquitted and 2,665 years of jail time was shared out amongst the guilty.
- The trial had to be held in a bomb-proof bunker with bullet-proof glass used in court. The court was also protected by a helicopter, 3,000 soldiers and a tank.

Discussion Questions

3. Discuss the feelings of Chad towards the Mafia at the end of the video. How do those feelings relate to your interactions with control freaks in your life?
4. Pray for each other to be free of all manipulation, control and blackmail.
