### Primary Lesson ~ Learning to follow the conscience God has given you

This lesson uses the delicate instrument of a compass to teach about the importance of listening to your conscience. The needle of a compass should always point True North, except when a stronger magnetic field is influencing it. This episode encourages young people to get rid of all exterior pulls in their lives that take them away from following God's true course. Discover the compass of your conscience that God has given you. It will lead you to for an even greater treasure and source of direction from heaven!



## Facts, Figures & Illustrations

A compass in the Northern Hemisphere truly does point in a northerly direction, but not to the North Pole. Instead, the compass points to the North Magnetic Pole, which, as Sir James Clark Ross discovered in 1831, is located at the northernmost point of the Arctic coast of North America. Similarly, a compass in the Southern hemisphere always points to the South Magnetic Pole, which is firmly planted south of Australia, in Antarctica. In the south, compass needles actually do point true South, to the South Magnetic field.

- During midsummer, the radical leaves of the compass plant invariably point precisely north and south.
- The rings of a tree are always farther apart on the tree's southern side. Woodsmen often read tree rings to find the compass points.
- Honeybees navigate using the Sun as a compass, even when it is hidden behind clouds - they find it via the polarization of ultraviolet light from areas of blue sky.
- Women navigate by landmarks and visual memories. Men navigate by direction and distance, and tend to be better at reading maps.
- According to Aristotle, wind direction determined whether a baby would be a boy or a girl.

## Discussion Questions

1. Write down and discuss the three strongest pulls in your life that try to get you off track in your relationship with God. Specifically, what distracts you from having personal prayer, worship or devotional times?
2. Think and discuss one area that used to bother your conscience but now does not bother you as much. Has it been good or bad to have this change?
3. Read Psalm 51, King David's prayer of repentance after he committed adultery and murder. What is the significance of David praying "...renew a right spirit within me..." in relation to our conscience?
4. Pray with each other that God will wash your consciences with the blood of Jesus and make your conscience tender and sensitive again.



## Complimentary Story ~ Gandhi and Candy

The following story is of the great spiritual leader of India, Mahatma Gandhi. Though he was not a Christian, he taught many principles about life that are based in wisdom.

Gandhi was visited by a very worried mother. She had an elementary-age boy who would eat large amounts of candy and sweets whenever his mother was not looking. She would hide the candy but the boy would find it and even get candy from relatives and neighbors. He would not listen when his mother told him how bad the candy was for him, how it would destroy his teeth and his health. Finally in desperation, she thought of taking him to see the famous Mahatma Gandhi.

Gandhi was a living legend, hugely respected in all of India at that time. The mother knew if Gandhi told the boy to stop eating candy, he would certainly listen. It took her three days of standing in a very long line to get an audience with the great leader. When she finally saw him, she told him her problem. "Please," she said, "will you simply tell my son to stop eating candy. I know he will obey you."

Mr. Gandhi looked up at her and quietly said, "Lady, please come back and see me in two weeks." The mother left looking confused, not understanding why, after waiting three days in line, she would need to come back. Although puzzled, she did not dare question the wisdom of this revered man.

Two weeks later, she patiently waited three days in another long line and finally received a second audience with Mahatma Gandhi.
